
ALUM HOLLOW TRAIL TOUR

Green Mountain Nature Preserve



TOUR ROUTE

Alum Hollow Trailhead » Alum Hollow Trail » Back to Alum Hollow Trailhead (approximately 3 miles)

Alum Hollow Trail is a short easy scenic hike to a small waterfall and small overhanging cliff. This trail is well marked. Follow the signs that read "Alum Hollow Trail". During summer, you will be buried deep in lush green trees as you wind around the plateau. During winter, the trees are bare and you have a beautiful view of the mountains surrounding you. As you hike, you will cross a bridge over a calming creek and finish at a small, but beautiful waterfall.

When the water is running high, this area has several waterfalls around it right off of Alum Hollow Trail on Oak Bluff Trail. If you are facing the main waterfall from Alum Hollow, you can turn around and follow Alum Cave to a nearby cave shelter hidden under the cliffside. Turn back around and follow Alum Hollow Trail back to your car, or those of you in shape, follow Ranger Trail back near the beginning of Alum Hollow down winding trails through trees, around large boulders, and over creekbeds.

Hike Notes: Alum Hollow Trail is a moderate hike. The majority of the trail is flat and easy with a few sections of changing elevation towards the end. If you choose to extend your hike by exploring Ranger Trail, expect a more difficult hike.
